ATTENDANCE- "EVERY DAY COUNTS"

This past month (February) students (and their parents) have worked really hard to improve our attendance rates, and we really appreciate the great effort!

Our overall school attendance for the month of February was 84.5%. Our goal each month is to be at 90% and higher. 49% of our student population attended 90% or more in February.

We had 104 students with PERFECT ATTENDANCE in February! These students will be treated to a special celebration this month in recognition of their dedication to attendance. To qualify for monthly perfect attendance awards, we use am and pm attendance numbers from our Maplewood program.
