With students being out of school for a couple of weeks, literacy skills might get a little rusty, so here are a few holiday ideas for keeping students practicing literacy skills at home:

ATTENDANCE- "EVERY DAY COUNTS"

Attendance is crucial to a child's education. As our attendance rates continue to grow (thank you so much to our awesome parents), so do our academic accomplishments (i.e. our PAT scores are on the rise). Here are a few things you should know about attendance here at St. Theresa:

Each month we send home certificates for students who have 90% and above attendance.

Students who attend 100% of the month are considered Perfect Attenders and get to attend a perfect attendance celebration. The last celebration we had, students got to decorate ice cream cone Christmas trees. In january , they will be sliding and having hot chocolate.

At our assembly each month, we honour students who have most improved attendance for the month with a certificate and a prize.

The parents of all students in a month who attend 90%-100% are entered in a draw and 3 parents' names are picked to receive a \$25.00 gift card to thank them for sending their children to school regularly.

The top 3 classes every month get awarded our coveted trophies at the assembly each month.

Many of our classroom teachers have their own incentive programs for their students.

At the end of the year, students who have had perfect attendance all year will receive bikes as an award. To qualify, students cannot have any lates or leave earlies.

We also send home letters every month to the parents of students who have missed 20% or more of a month to let them know how many days they have missed.

CHRISTMAS CARNIVAL—We will be hosting a super fun Christmas Carnival on the last day of school before the holiday break. Tickets will not be sold for the event, instead students have been collecting tickets for every day of school they attend. The tickets are used at the carnival to play the games or participate in activities. We will have a lot of prizes. Everyone is really excited for the event. To ensure your child has a lot of tickets so they can really enjoy themselves, please ensure you send them to school every day.

ODD & ENDS

1. There have been cases of lice in the school. We would like to remind parents to regularly check their child's head for nits (the white eggs) and louse (the bugs themselves) as they can occur very suddenly and can become severe very quickly. If you do discover your child has lice, please keep them at home until they are lice and nit free. If we suspect your child has lice, you may receive a phone call from our office here at the school asking you to treat your child and to ensure that they are lice and nit free before returning to school. This has been our school policy the last several years and is in effect to ensure that we all do our part to make sure that we eliminate this nuisance from our school, and ultimately your homes. Lice is considered an excused absence as it is a medical illness. Some ways to treat head lice are to purchase the correct formula at the pharmacy, or create your own solution with dawn dish soap, vinegar, and tea tree oil. The best treatment this year we have found is repeated combing of the hair with a magnetic lice comb, which can be purchased at a pharmacy. It is also important to ensure that all bedding is cleaned properly to remove any nits. Old hairbrushes, etc. should be replaced as well. It is also a good idea to talk to your child about not sharing hairbrushes and to keep personal space from others. Thanks to everyone for your cooperation with this matter.
